

POSTDOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP

Position Summary

Applications are invited for a postdoctoral fellow position in the School of Public Health and Health Systems at the University of Waterloo. The successful candidate will join the <u>Advancing Research in Children's Health (ARCH) Lab</u> directed by Dr. Mark Ferro, Canada Research Chair in Youth Mental Health.

Dr. Ferro's program of research investigates the link between physical and mental health in children and young people. His research takes a developmental approach to understanding the multilevel determinants of mental health and quality of life outcomes in children with chronic health conditions. He also has interests in health service use among children, family and stress processes influencing child health, and health trajectories during the transition from childhood to young adulthood. Methodologically, Dr. Ferro has interests in the measurement of mental health and quality of life in young people.

One postdoctoral fellowship is immediately available to join the ARCH Lab. The successful candidate will be provided the opportunity to develop their own independent program of research in the broad areas of child and young person multimorbidity, mental health, or substance use using epidemiological data from Canada, the United States, or elsewhere. The candidate will be expected to publish their research in peer-reviewed journals and lead and contribute to the development of grant proposals to CIHR and other funding agencies. The position is funded for two years with the possibility of renewal for a third year (contingent on available funding). Health benefits are included.

Requirements

This fellowship is suitable for candidates who have a PhD in epidemiology, biostatistics, public health, psychology, or other relevant fields. Excellent working knowledge of epidemiologic methods and well-developed ability of statistical programming and analytical skills using R, SAS, or STATA are required. Strong evidence of prior research productivity is an asset.
